We solve the problem, and redirect the child onto another activity. Children yearn to please their elders, and do so by showing and imitating similar expressions to us (both physical and verbal).

When a dog misbehaves, we need to take a step back and think. What are we asking of them? What are they bred to do? What function is their breed expected to carry-out? If we take those few minutes to reflect and ask ourselves those questions... we will then be able to get the right answers. It is your responsibility as a pet owner to search for the answers, if you are unsure as to what to do or how to do it.

There is, however, ONE commonality between the human race and that of our K-9 friends... it is the never-ending need to be guided and loved in the appropriate manner. It is then that we (humans and dogs) can learn to live happy and fulfilled lives.
