HOW TO ANSWER THE HARD QUESTION.

- Are you done having kids?
- What are you waiting for? You aren't getting any younger?

I am sure you can relate. These have all been asked of me by people who love me dearly and strangers alike during one of the most challenging seasons of miscarriages. Our last of three miscarriages was over Thanksgiving weekend.

How do you respond?

Mother in waiting, grieving, or simply in the middle of healing, I hope these simple but direct responses to an overwhelming question after loss or uncertainty. I do not have your answers in a season of waiting, but don't give up; keep your hope; the wait is hard but worth it.

- It's taken our family a lot to get to this point. I'm focusing on where we are now.
- That's a big hard question. I'm not ready to answer that.
- We've been through a lot and lost a pregnancy(s). I have fought hard for my health and am not ready to explore children at this time.
- I'm not open to discussing that topic.
 We're leaning in on the Lord's timing and trusting His plan for our family.

Before we close and go out to be with family or among social gatherings this season, my prayer for you in a season of unknown and grief.

Lord, this season is filled with pain and waiting. It is unbearable at times. I ask you boldly to give me the strength to be present and not hide from uncomfortable circumstances with the ability to hold tight to your promise that I am enough just as I am. My love or worth does not rely on my ability to be a mother on this side of heaven. Lord, be with me and carry me through the difficulties and hardness of my circumstances through your grace and redemptive love. Amen
